

## Q & A with the Staff

*In light of Jesus' instruction to turn the other cheek, is it right for Christians to defend themselves and their families such as if an intruder breaks into their homes?*

This is an important issue for followers of Christ to consider because it not only impacts self defense but also service in the military and war. The short answer is that it is permissible indeed for Christians to defend themselves and their families and to serve in the military even if that requires the shedding of blood. Let's interact with the teaching concerning turning the other cheek first and then we will present a biblical case for self defense.

### Turn the Other Cheek

Most often people read this instruction in Matthew 5 and believe it means that if anyone ever wants to do any sort of physical harm, the Christian response is to allow it to happen (pacifism). However, that is not what Jesus was saying in this passage. In Jewish culture, slapping a person's cheek was a serious personal insult. That is what Jesus is addressing. If your pride is injured, allow it. Don't retaliate in kind. When it is understood in its rightful context, the "turn the other cheek clause" cannot be used to disallow self defense.

### The Argument for Self Defense

Even if the "turn the other cheek" clause does not disallow self defense, can a biblical case be made to support using it? Indeed one can. Consider five pertinent factors:

- (1) **We are to care for our bodies** (1 Corinthians 5:19-20). While this is certainly not the most persuasive argument, it is not without merit. We have a biblical mandate to take care of our bodies, Christ's present temple on earth, and certainly being passive while being beaten or worse would not fulfill this command.
- (2) **We are to protect the innocent.** One does not need to read the Bible long before one finds God's heart for the innocent. (By "innocent" we do not mean innocent of sin; we mean the defenseless such as widows, orphans, the infirm, etc.) God clearly cares for those who cannot care for themselves. The church must follow God's heart and be
- (3) **champions for the weak and defenseless:** battered women, the unborn, oppressed minorities, etc. What would you suppose God's heart would be if a criminal broke into a home with a family that included young children? Do you suppose God seeks glory in the husband/father passively allowing his family to be brutalized and slaughtered? Or do you suppose God's heart would be for the husband/father to protect his family?

# A Heart for the Homeless in Tampa

About four years ago, I was a proud husband, a new dad, and a breakfast chef at LazyDays RV Center in Lakeland. Life was good, and I really was enjoying all that God was doing in my walk with Him and my family.

Then one day, my boss asked me to join him and some of his friends on an upcoming Monday night. What I assumed was going to be a gathering of some buddies to watch Monday Night Football, turned out to be a night that would forever change my life. My boss picked me up and we headed downtown to what is now Curtis Hixon Park. As we got out of the car I began to see a large gathering of people I often drive by and ignore. Up until this point in my life I had given very little thought to them.

That night I was introduced to *Amazing Love Ministries*, the outpouring of the love of God in the life of a Tampa couple named Jim and Barb Killeen. Several years ago God impressed upon this couple the need of the homeless within our city. Rather than sitting by and waiting for someone else to meet the need, they set

out to work by passing out McDonald’s cheeseburgers. It grew and grew and today they serve roughly 200 people each week. In addition *Amazing Love Ministries* provides food, clothes, and job training and also offers opportunities for worship and service for those who are called by God.

The most amazing thing about this ministry is each week, they offer the opportunity for you and me to get off the couch, put love into action, and meet with those whom Jesus would be among. Rather than looking at the guy on the corner as a panhandler, you begin to know him as Tom, the man recovering from addiction, suffering from terrible loss, and trying to get off the street. Or Robert, the man who lost his business and sense of self-worth, turned to alcohol, lost his family, hasn’t seen his kids in twenty-

five years, and has been homeless so long he doesn’t know what it would mean to live in a home, pay rent, or even have a bank account.

As I began to share my life and swap stories with people at *Amazing Love*, the people I had spent my life ignoring and judging, became real people whom I could no longer judge or ignore. I had to help. They were people. And they needed to experience the love of Jesus and His Bride, just like I do.

*Amazing Love* has done two things for me. One, it has taken my blinders off to the need to love the forgotten and ignored in our city; and two, it has helped me realize that while I can sit around and “talk” about doing good, it is not until I roll up my sleeves and get involved that anything actually get done!

Here is the question that I have...what are you doing to BE the church and meet needs in our city for our Savior?

## Summer CrossTraining

The summer semester of CrossTraining begins on Sunday, July 10, and runs for seven weeks ending on August 21. Participants can choose from one of three courses that will be offered this semester:



***Shaped by Biblical Truths***, led by Roger Block, will address certain bedrock biblical truths that impact not only what followers of Christ believe, but also how we should live. This course will solidify what you believe and also perhaps give you new insight into why you believe it.

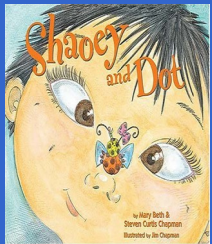
***The Way of the Master***, led by Chris Haight, is designed to help participants better share their faith in a natural manner. This course will use the popular training program that emphasizes knowing the gospel rather than knowing a presentation.

***Sunday School 101***, led by Brian Dembowczyk, is primarily for all Sunday School teachers, directors, and leaders but anyone with a heart for this critical Bible study ministry is welcome to participate. Participants will interact with the three purposes of Sunday School—teaching, community, and ministry—and learn some practical techniques for growing in each.

Also, look for a re-launch of CrossTraining beginning in mid-September. Several “core” courses (e.g. *Basic Doctrine, Introduction to the Bible, Bible Study Methods, Introduction to the Old Testament and New Testament, The Life of Christ*) will be introduced and offered on a repeating basis. These courses are designed to be foundational for any follower of Christ and everyone will be encouraged to take them at least once. In addition, other meaningful courses will continue to be offered to help you grow and apply your faith.

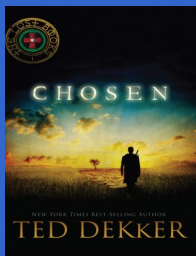
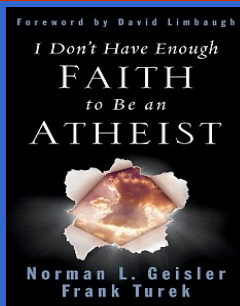
**Shaoey and Dot: Bug Meets Bundle**

- (3) **Jesus clearly allowed self-defense** (Luke 22:36). Jesus instructed his disciples to buy a sword if they did not already have one. While some try to spiritualize this instruction, it makes no sense to do that.
- (4) **Self-defense does not mitigate trust in God.** While some contend that self defense negates our need to trust in God that does not have to be so. Wayne Grudem argues that taking the proper precautions in life is in accordance with trusting in God. He illustrates this by saying he trusts in God to watch over him, yet he uses his seat belt, buys life insurance, locks his door, etc. One can easily refute the argument presented above if it is followed to its fullness. Would a person offering the above argument take medicine? Hold a job? Jump off a skyscraper?
- (5) **Self-defense prevents and restrains evil.** Let’s go back to the illustration of the family and the home intruder for a moment. Suppose the intruder intended to break into the home and assault and then murder each family member. Surely that would be evil. Now suppose the husband/father stopped the intruder by the use of physical force. Evil would have been restrained.

Clearly one can see the Bible condones self defense and followers of Christ don’t just have liberty to do so, but have an accountability to do so as well.
