From High School to the World Beyond

What an exciting and emotional time of year! Final exams and projects are on your child's agenda, and for some of you, you've already picked up the cap and gown for graduation day. (Sigh!) Here are some insights I've picked up about dealing with the transition from high school to the world beyond...

Making the transition to college (or the world of full-time work) is a major step not only for young people but also for their parents. It's what many people view as the "end" of their major parenting duties. But in fact, your kids need you now more than ever. As high school seniors start to grasp their move to adulthood, many feel compelled to re-engage their parents in meaningful ways though they rarely admit it. Parents can use this brief window of opportunity to strengthen their relationship with their teenagers and also to help their teenagers strengthen their relationship with God. Ideas for doing this include:

- Spend one-on-one time with your soon-to-be-graduate, possibly at a retreat-like setting. Make fun memories, share a meal, and engage in discussions about life beyond high school.
- Embrace the emerging adult lurking inside your teenager. Begin talking to him or her more as an "equal," sharing your own stories of stepping out into the real world.
- Connect your kids with thriving college-age adults. Seek a campus minister on your son's or daughter's new campus to provide positive examples and mentors.

Getting involved in a campus ministry is key not only for making it through but also for possibly helping young people dodge obstacles and challenges. Many great Christian campus ministries are active on college campuses. Here are some thoughts on them that make them worth exploring:

- They provide a community of friends that can be very healthy. These people can serve as a great source of accountability and connection. Some could become best friends with your kids.
- They offer exposure to people who have completely different church and family backgrounds and who view things entirely differently from your student. Kids are forced to think through why they believe what they believe—possibly for the first time.
- Most of these ministries have a mission on campus. This is great because college students often tend to lose their sense of mission. They'll be focused on themselves, homework, and social activities and can easily lose sight of the fact that people need to know what they know—the gospel. Campus ministries can really encourage young people to stay strong in their faith.

When God places young people on a college campus, they should embrace the experience with everything they have. Encourage your teenagers to get involved, meet people, and make a difference for Christ. Thank you for the joy of partnering with you in ministry.

June Panel Discussions

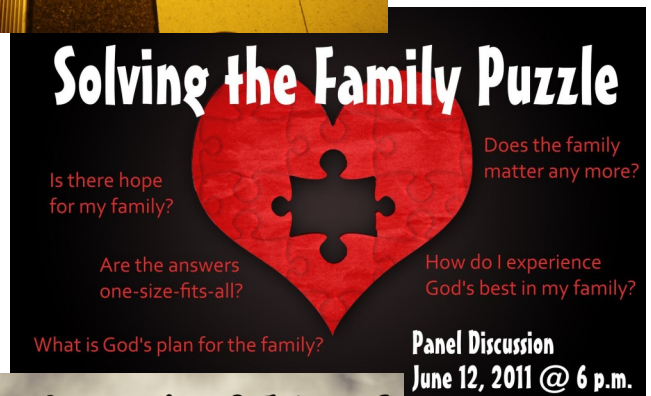

Let's imagine a scene at the Bema Seat of Christ where rewards are received or lost:

Jesus: "Well, Christian, how did you use the time, talents, and treasure I gave you on earth?"

Christian: "I went to church Sundays, taught Sunday School, tithed regularly, tried to live a good life."

Jesus: "That's all good. Why did you never go on mission?"

Christian: "Well, I just never felt called to go on mission."

Jesus: "Why were you waiting for a call when I told you to 'Go'?"

Christian: "Well, uh, I just didn't understand."

Jesus: "What part of 'Go' didn't you understand?"

Sound facetious? But is it really? In Matthew 28:19, Jesus said, "**Go**" and make disciples. In Acts 1:8 Jesus said, "You **shall be** my witnesses...to the ends of the earth." Mission trips are for our good and His glory. Let me tell you some reasons of going aside from being obedient:

There is no greater thrill than being used by God to help bring someone to Christ. I have had some fantastic divine appointments. On my first trip to Sao Paulo, Brazil in 2005, I found myself in a beautiful park with a bright, young couple who were eager to hear and accept the gospel. It was totally un-

And how can they preach unless they are sent? As it is written, how welcome are the feet of those who announce the gospel of good things. Romans 10:15

expected and unplanned. The circumstances that put us together could only have been orchestrated by God. All appointments are divine but some are just mind boggling.

Americans still open doors. We need to gain a hearing to share the gospel. We may need to build a relationship, or we can fly thousands of miles to Brazil, Korea, or Manila. Many people there will listen to an American because he

has traveled so far. Then it's the power of the gospel and the work of the Holy Spirit to bring one to salvation. We now have windows of opportunity abroad where Americans are still viewed favorably and people fear God. Those windows may soon close. Let's seize the opportunity now.

Other people can teach us much. Koreans have shown me the power of prayer. In 2004 on our first two days, my partner Larry and I shared with 32 people. This church had prayed over the people we were to visit. Of the 32 people, 31 accepted Christ. The only one who declined was a husband who was not expected to be home when we visited. Very probably he had not been prayed over. Jesus said, "If you want to rob the strongman's house, you must first bind the strongman" (Mark 3:27).

Many internationals don't take rejection personally. I met with a real estate man; we had a good visit but he wanted to think about it. I left somewhat dejected. I asked the Korean pastor if we could have done more. He said in an almost cavalier fashion, "No, we did all we could, it's now up to God." He's right, but it's a hard lesson to learn. Incidentally, within a year he accepted Christ. Some sow, some reap.

North American and Western Europe have lost their fear of God. But many people around the world still fear God and are hungry for God's Word. The ball is in our court.

The fringe benefits are fantastic. You get to travel and work with great comrades. You are exposed to other cultures and some of the warmest people on the planet. You get to eat some really tasty ethnic foods. You learn there is a Christian culture. You have more in common in the important values of life with a Filipino Christian than you do with your next door neighbor who is not a Christian.

Are you ready to go? You'll wonder why it took you so long to get started. How about Korea in October?

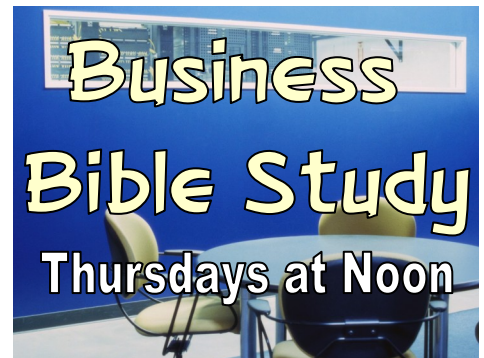
- **Panel Discussions**

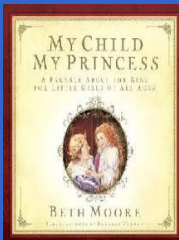

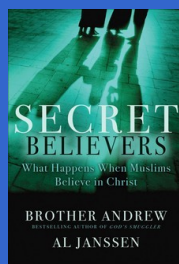
My Child, My Princess
